

Camden Site Allocations Plan - Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulation 26 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 this Adoption Statement gives notice that the London Borough of Camden resolved to adopt its Site Allocations Plan on 9 September 2013.

The Site Allocations Plan will form part of Camden's Local Development Framework (LDF), a group of documents setting out the Council's planning strategy and policies. It identifies the more major sites that are likely to come forward for development by 2025. For each of these, we have set out suggested planning guidance and these will eventually affect how future planning applications may be decided.

Any person aggrieved by the Site Allocations Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that;

- (i) the Plan is not within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004; or
- (ii) a procedural requirement of the Act or its associated Regulations has not been complied with.

Any such application must be promptly and in any event no later than the end of the six week challenge period, starting with the date on which the Plan was adopted (9th September 2013).
