

1 Introduction

- 1.1 This **Local Development Scheme (LDS)** provides information on the documents that the Council intends to produce to form its planning policy framework and sets out the timetable and programme for their production.
- 1.2 For each of the documents that will make up Camden's planning framework, we describe their purpose, status, the area they cover and their timetable. Section 3 below and Appendix 1 provide information on the planning policy documents that the Council intends to prepare and when they will be produced.

2 Camden's planning policy framework

- 2.1 The 'development plan' for Camden currently consists of the **Local Plan** and the Mayor's London Plan. The Council's decisions on planning applications should be taken in line with the development plan unless there are significant matters ('material considerations') that indicate otherwise. The Local Plan contains the Council's vision, policies and proposals for the use of land and buildings in the borough.
- 2.2 The Local Plan is currently made up of the following adopted documents:
 - Camden Core Strategy (adopted 2010)
 - Camden Development Policies (adopted 2010)
 - Site Allocations (adopted 2013)
 - Fitzrovia Area Action Plan (adopted 2014)
 - Euston Area Plan (adopted 2015)
 - Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan (adopted 2015)
- 2.3 These have been prepared though a formal review process, which includes an examination held by a government-appointed Inspector.
- 2.4 Supplementary planning documents (SPD) are subject to public consultation but are not subject to testing at an independent examination and therefore do not have the same weight in planning decisions as development plan documents. However, they have a valuable role in complementing development plan documents with more detailed advice on how policies can be implemented and can be given substantial weight in planning decisions. A list of Camden's adopted SPDs can be found in Appendix 2.
- 2.5 The Council's Statement of Community Involvement 2011 (SCI) sets out how we intend to involve the community in the preparation, alteration and review of its planning documents and in planning decisions. The production of the Council's planning documents should be in accordance with the SCI. The SCI is currently being updated and the programme is detailed below.

3 Planning documents being prepared by the Council

- 3.1 The planning documents that Camden intends to prepare over the course of the period covered by this Local Development Scheme are listed below:
 - Camden Local Plan
 - Site Allocations
 - North London Waste Plan
 - Camden Planning Guidance updates
 - Statement of Community Involvement
- 3.2 Detailed information on these documents is set out in the profiles in Appendix 1.

4 Neighbourhood plans

- 4.1 Local communities have the power to influence the future of the places they live by preparing neighbourhood plans. Neighbourhood plans are led and prepared by the community, not the Council, although the Council has a statutory role to provide advice and support to those producing a plan. When neighbourhood plans are passed by an independent examiner and at a local referendum, the Council must adopt them a part of its planning framework and take them into account when it makes decisions on planning applications in the area, alongside our adopted development plan documents and the London Plan.
- 4.2 As neighbourhood plans are not prepared by the Council and their timetables are dependent on the progress made by the community, we have not included them in the list of documents in this Local Development Scheme.
- 4.3 The following neighbourhood forums and areas have been approved to date:
 - Highgate (December 2012),
 - Kentish Town (April 2013),
 - Fortune Green and West Hampstead (May 2013),
 - Somers Town (June 2013)
 - Dartmouth Park (October 2013).
 - Camley Street (February 2014)
 - Fitzrovia East (area only April 2014)
 - Church Row and Perrins Walk (September 2014)
 - Redington and Frognal (September 2014)
 - Hampstead (October 2014)
 - Mount Pleasant (February 2016)

Fortune Green and West Hampstead Neighbourhood Plan was the first Neighbourhood Plan in Camden to have passed examination and a local referendum and now forms part of the borough's statutory Development Plan and is used alongside the Council's own plans in planning decisions in the neighbourhood area.

5 Monitoring and review

- 5.1 The Council will monitor the progress of the work set out in this Local Development Scheme and will publish the results as part of our annual Authority Monitoring Reports.
- 5.2 The Local Development Scheme will be updated or reviewed where the need to do so is identified.

Appendix 1 - Document Profiles

Camden Local Plan

Purpose / Content

The Core Strategy 2011 sets out the spatial vision and strategic objectives for Camden and the core strategic policies. Development Policies 2011 provide greater detail to those policies and sets out criteria against which planning applications will be considered.

The Local Plan will update the Core Strategy and Development Policies to create a single document. The production of the Local Plan will ensure that Camden continues to have robust, effective and up-to-date planning policies that reflect current circumstances. This will allow the Council to make planning decisions that deliver economic growth that brings benefit to the borough; secure healthy, sustainable communities; and contribute towards reducing inequalities.

Site Allocations

Purpose / Content

Camden's Sites Allocation Plan was adopted in September 2013 and sets out guidelines for future development on significant sites which are likely to be subject to development proposals. There is now a need for it to be updated. A number of the sites have come forward for development so can be removed and potential new major sites should be identified to meet Camden's need for homes, jobs and facilities. The Allocations will also need to be updated to ensure they are consistent with the Local Plan once it is adopted.

Work has progressed in relation to planning policy for gypsy and travellers, with an up to date Needs Assessment for Gypsy and Traveller Communities being published in 2014. Indicative targets have been incorporated into the revised Housing Policies in the Local Plan Submission Draft 2016. The approach remains that sites for travellers will be secured either by formally reserving Council owned land for traveller accommodation, obtaining planning permission and / or through a review of the Sites Allocation document.

Camden Planning Guidance

Purpose / Content

Camden Planning Guidance (CPG) is a set of documents that provide further detail to support the implementation of the Council's adopted planning policies. Camden has eight adopted CPG documents that deal with design, housing, sustainability, basements, town centres and employment, amenity, transport and planning obligations. The CPG documents were originally adopted in two phases in 2010 and 2011 and have been updated on an ongoing basis.

We have two planned updates to the CPG. A minor amendment to CPG2 – Housing is proposed to support the delivery of affordable housing and ensure that it is permanently available to those Camden Households with the greatest housing needs.

Following the adoption of the Local Plan all CPG documents will require updating to provide guidance on the Council's updated planning policies and strategic approach.

Statement of Community Involvement - update

Purpose / Content

The Council's Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) sets out how we will involve local people when we consider planning applications and prepare our planning policies and is a requirement of the Planning and Compulsory Act 2004. Our first Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) was adopted in 2006 and it was last revised in July 2011. Since then there have been a number of changes in planning legislation which have amended the statutory requirements and introduced the duty to co-operate and Neighbourhood Planning. We also need to consider the impacts of the Councils financial strategy and the opportunities that have arisen due to increased electronic working practices. We will therefore update the SCI to take these into account and update how we will involve the community in making decisions on planning applications. Once adopted, the Council is legally obliged to comply with the SCI.

Sites of nature conservation importance Guidance (September 2006)

Our Sites of Nature Conservation Importance Guidance provides information on sites within the borough that have valuable species and habitats requiring protection (as identified by ecologists, from the Greater London Authority ecology unit, who surveyed the borough in the summer of 2003). These sites are displayed on our proposals map.

Retrofitting planning guidance (June 2011)

This is non-statutory guidance aimed at home owners who wish to make their home more sustainable. It is being updated to take account of new permitted development rights.

Energy efficiency planning guidance for Dartmouth Park Conservation Area (August 2012) and Holly Lodge Estate Conservation Area (January 2013)

We have prepared this planning guidance to provide advice and information to householders who are considering making energy efficiency improvements to their homes. Borough wide guidance will now be prepared.
