

# Camden Local Plan - Adoption Statement

In accordance with Regulation 26 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended) this Adoption Statement hereby gives notice that on 3 July 2017 the London Borough of Camden adopted the Camden Local Plan as a development plan document.

The Camden Local Plan was the subject of an independent examination conducted by Katie Childs, BSc (hons) MA, MRTPI, an Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. In her report published in May 2017 the Inspector confirmed subject to a number of main modifications the Plan was sound and recommended its adoption. The recommended main modifications have been included in the adopted Camden Local Plan document which now carry full weight in the consideration of planning applications and replace the Core Strategy and Development Policies documents (2010).

Any person aggrieved by the Camden Local Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113(3) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- (a) the Camden Local Plan is not within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004; or
- (b) a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made not later than the end of the period of six weeks starting with the date on which the Camden Local Plan was adopted (3 July 2017).

In accordance with Regulations 26 and 35 of the 2012 Regulations the following documents have been made available:

- (i) the Camden Local Plan;
- (ii) this Adoption Statement and
- (iii) the Sustainability Appraisal Report document.
